## ONE TEACHER'S CRAYONS STORY

Teachers are the lifeblood of Crayons to Computers! They bring the expertise to know what core supplies are needed in the classroom and the creativity to turn gently used and unique items into tools to introduce or reinforce learning concepts.

During the 2021-22 school year, 3,505 teachers shopped at least once and accounted for a total of 10,650 shops with Crayons to Computers.

Jennifer McAfee teaches second grade at Southern Elementary in rural Pendleton County School District. She has shopped at Crayons for more than 17 years and first learned about the Store from a teacher who'd previously shopped while teaching in Cincinnati Public Schools.

Jennifer says, "My most shopped areas are the new writing area, pick 1, miscellaneous and the Crafts with Conviction area for chair covers and shape journals. My classroom functions thanks to Crayons to Computers. My kids have chair covers to hold books, rulers, crayons, pencils, notebooks, tape, glue sticks, colored pencils,
and scissors. Our students do bring in supplies from the supply list, but I keep [the chair pockets] stocked for the year with items I get from shopping.
"I use candy and miscellaneous items (flashlights, small notebooks) to fill my treasure box. I also get lots of new books and markers which I give out to students during the holiday season.
"I always have my students write thank you notes to send to donors because we really appreciate them. Shopping at Crayons to Computers is exciting because there is always something new to find."

Jennifer concludes, "The life of a teacher is demanding, hectic, and ever changing. Being able to get a lot of our supplies donated really eases the minds of my students and me because we have the things we need to be successful every day. Crayons to Computers enables me to get the extras for my students-without taking money from my own pocket and family."

The staff estimates that she has received more than $\$ 250,000$ of product through Crayons over 18 years to benefit the five Grant County Schools for which she taught art until her recent retirement.
